#### A new complexity function of repetition and irrationality exponents.

We introduce and study a new complexity function in combinatorics on words, which takes into account the smallest return time of a factor of an infinite word. We characterize the eventually periodic words and the Sturmian words by means of this function. Then, we establish a new result on repetitions in Sturmian words and show that it is best possible. We deduce a lower bound for the irrationality exponent of real numbers whose sequence of  $b$ -ary digits is a Sturmian sequence over  $\{0, 1, \dots, b-1\}$  and we prove that this lower bound is best possible. If the irrationality exponent of  $\forall x_i$  is equal to 2 or slightly greater than 2, then the  $b$ -ary expansion of  $\forall x_i$  cannot be 'too simple', in a suitable sense. Our result applies, among other classical numbers, to badly approximable numbers, non-zero rational powers of  $e$ , and  $\log(1+1/a)$ , provided that the integer  $a$  is sufficiently large. It establishes an unexpected connection between the irrationality exponent of a real number and its  $b$ -ary expansion. This is joint work with Yann Bugeaud.
